Key note address was delivered by Dr. (Mrs.) Madhavi Ghorpade wherein she highlighted the importance Surgical Patient Safety and discussed International guidelines of patient safety. She also emphasized nurses' role in patient safety.

Session 1: - Ms. Dipali Dhole, ICN, Deenanath Mangeshkar Hospital, Pune presented her topic on 'Surgical safety guidelines and protocols for nursing management'. She elaborated on the following:-

- Surgical safety checklist and recent guidelines
- Nurses responsibility in Pre-operative, intra operative, and post operative care
- Sterile techniques essential for preventing surgical site infection.
- Newer modalities like robotic surgical techniques
- Applications of skilled nursing practices in field of surgery

This session was supplemented by information given by one of the Participant who was OT Nurse In charge of Deenanath Mangeshkar Hospital. She shared her views on various intra operative guidelines essential to prevent harm to the patient during peri-operative period.

Session 2: In the session on "Evidence based nursing in surgical safety", Mrs. Sarika Nigade Assistant Matron, Inlaks and Budhrani Hospital, focused on patient safety practices used to improve surgical care to patients. She elaborated on

- Incidence and prevalence rate of unsafe surgical practices,
- Statistical data related to compliance rate of Safe OT practices by nurses and other health care workers.
- Advanced techniques and recent guidelines about sterilization of articles.
- Routine and terminal cleaning of operation theatres
- · Recent guild lines for CSSD units of hospitals
- Various recent evidence based practices in nursing care of surgical patients.







1. Skill Station 1: ISBAR framework of handing over (Introduction, Situation, Background, Assessment, Recommendation): -

It was conducted by Ms. Ashwini Shinde and Ms. Priyanka, F. Y. M. Sc N Students. They explained about handing and taking over techniques using ISBAR framework. They used the Role play method to enact handing over scenarios at various clinical situations including shift handing over in surgical ward, handing over of patient from surgical ward to OT and returning from OT to ward.


2. Skill Station 2: Wound Dressing


3. Skills Station 3: Surgical Site Skin Preparation

Topic: Infection Control Practices Series II- Maternal & Child Safety including Adult

First & Second year M.Sc Nursing & Second P B B Sc students conducted workshop on Infection Control Practices Series II- Maternal & Child Safety including Adult Safety on 24th April 2024.

The details of the workshop are as follows:

Workshop started with lamp lighting and Theme inauguration by Dr. Manisha Kadam Vice-Principal. The Key note address was delivered by Mrs Jaya John which highlighted the importance of engaging Nurses in patient safety by doing no harm to patients when involved in patient care and International Patient safety goals. She also told the importance of Series II, briefly explained about Series I, and provided information on maternal, child and adult safety. The plenary sessions were conducted by Ms Supriya Chakare, S Y M.Sc student.

SESSION 1- Maternal Safety

The guest speaker Mrs Stephina Fernandes, Nurse Educator from Sahayadri Hospital, Deccan, Pune. She explained in detail about maternal safety during labour process, she also explained in detail about labour room preparation. She told that Doula Nurse is taking care of mother in antenatal, natal and post natal period. One nurse is appointed exclusively for one women and taken care during all three phases. She also explained about the Water Birthing Practices carried out in Sahayadri Hospital. She also explained infection prevention protocol during Water Birthing and importance of Music Therapy during labour and Birthing.

She also asked few volunteers (students & staff nurses) to demonstarte steps of hand washing. They demonstarted seven steps by using blue ink on gloved hand. The technique helped us to understand that after following seven steps of hand washing, some areas of hand may remain uncleaned. The simple demonstartion technique sensitized all that during hand washing, few sites may remain uncleaned.





SESSION 2- Child safety

Ms. Neha Micheal, staff nurse, NICU, Deenanath Mangeshkar Hospital explained about child a safety practices during delivery. She mainly focused on the labour room preparation to receive newborn baby, Nurse preparation etc. She also told about the breastfeeding and Kangaroo Mother care practices done in NICU. The NICU preparation of DMH and nurses following protocol for infection prevention.





Session 3- Adult Safety

Ms Ciyona Chandane, staff Nurse, ICU, DMH spoke on adult safety. The session was very informative; she defined all the infection prevention practices followed in her hospital. She mainly highlighted VAP (Ventilator Associated Pneumonia), CAUTI (Catheter Associated Urinary Tract Infection), CLABSI (Central Line associated blood Stream Infection), and PLABSI (Peripheral Line associated Blood stream infection). The infection control practices of her hospital and several evidence based practices helped us to know the patient safety in detail.





After plenary session, students were directed for lunch. After lunch students, teachers and staff nurses were divided in three groups to attend skill station and remaining groups were made to seat in auditorium. These groups were shown videos on patient safety and organized quiz on Infection control and general knowledge.

SKILL STATIONS

The skill stations were arranged on third floor classrooms.

Skill station I- Maternal Safety- M.Sc student- Ms Priyanka, Ms Manisha Rathod. Teacher incharge: Mrs Jasmine Jesy and Mrs Christina Martin.

The skill station mainly focused on

- 1. Labor room preparation
- 2. Equipment care
- 3. Protocols for infection prevention in labor room



Skill station II- Child safety- M.Sc student, Mrs Supriya Sonawane, Ms Tejaswini, Teacher Incharge- Dr Samruddhi Bhakre

The skill station mainly focused on

- 1. Immediate new born care, APGAR Score, safe handling of newborn
- 2. Resuscitation preparation
- 3. Breastfeeding
- 4. Kangaroo mother care



Skill station III Second year classroom- VAP skill station - Msc student, Ms Reshma Gawande and Ms. Smita Sadaphal, Teacher incharge: Mrs Ujjwala Murkute, Mrs Jyoti Devare and Mrs Rupali Ladke.

The skill station was demonstrated to teach participants regarding Ventilator associated infection. It mainly focused on

- 1. Maintain ET tube cuff pressure.
- 2. Keeping the bed head elevated
- 3. Providing mouth care
- 4. Prevention of DVT
- 5. Appropriate Sedation use
- 6. Hand hygiene



Each skill station had 25 participants. Meanwhile the remaining students were seated in auditorium. For them Quiz on infection prevention and General Knowledge was arranged, also few videos were shown on infection prevention and patient safety.

In this session staff nurses of I & B Hospital, final year and IV Semester student gave feedback of the workshop. The feedback was also given by Vice-Principal, Dr Manisha Kadam.
